



Heirloom Fruits & Vegetables

- Uzbek Golden Carrot

- Baker Creek Heirloom Seeds
- The delectable, lemon-yellow roots have a unique shape! These carrots have a fine-grained texture that is crispy and juicy with plenty of natural sugar. Called “Mshak” in Uzbek, this variety is easy to grow in a range of soils and temperatures and the flavor is superb.



- Red Cored Chantenay Carrot

- Seed Savers Exchange
- This popular variety of carrot is easy to grow and has mildly sweet orange flesh with a reddish core. The 6in roots are great for just about anything—soups, canning and especially fresh eating.



- Lemon Cuke Cucumber

- Baker Creek Heirloom Seeds
- The shape, size, and color of a lemon, but with super-sweet flavor! Indeed, the lemon cucumber is a pretty convincing fake, with round, lemon-yellow fruit and a swollen blossom end, just like a real lemon. The tasty fruit is low in cucurbitacin, the naturally occurring bitter chemical in cukes. The flesh is citrusy and adds a real zip to salads!

- Alaska & Wando Peas

- Baker Creek Heirloom Seeds
- These two varieties of peas are very similar. They are both early season varieties that thrive in cooler temperatures. They both are noted as good producers, and yield semi-sweet, delicious peas!



- Purple Plum Radish

- Baker Creek Heirloom Seeds
- Here is one lovely radish, with its bright purple skin that makes this one of the most colorful varieties for marketing. 1½" globes have sweet, crisp, white flesh that does not get pithy. Very easy to grow and only takes one month!



- Atomic Grape Tomato

- Baker Creek Heirloom Seeds
- You won't want to miss these unique cherry tomatoes! The color (and flavor!) is a full-blown assault on the senses: lavender and purple stripes, turning to technicolor olive-green, red, and brown/blue stripes when fully ripe. Really wild! Olive green interior is blushed with red when dead-ripe. Amazing flavor!

- Cosmic Eclipse Tomato

- Baker Creek Heirloom Seeds
- Very unique variety. Beautiful fruits start off green with dark green stripes and striking indigo colored splashes. It ripens brick-red with green stripes and lots of black anthocyanin giving this a very beautiful multi-colored finish. Very good production. Early-mid season. Amazing sweet, rich and juicy flavor.

Heirloom Lettuces & Cabbages

- Groninger Brussels Sprouts

- Baker Creek Heirloom Seeds
- Groninger is an easy to grow, steady producing variety. These medium to small sprouts are an ideal choice for first timers. Sprouts form a tight head and maintain a delicate flavor even in variable weather. Best when harvested after a light frost.



- Early Jersey Wakefield Cabbage

- Baker Creek Heirloom Seeds
- Introduced in the 1840s, with tasty, 2lb, sweet and flavorful conical heads. This very early variety was sold commercially by Peter Henderson in the late 1860s.

- Speckled Lettuce

- *Seed Savers Exchange*
- *Family heirloom sent to SSE in 1983 by SSE member Mark Reusser. His father obtained it from Urias Martin, whose Mennonite ancestors likely brought it in the early 1800s from Pennsylvania to Ontario. Juicy thick leaves are green tinged with red. Delicious mild flavor.*



- Tennis Ball Lettuce

- *Baker Creek Heirloom Seeds*
- *Rather loose heads are petite, 4-6 inches in diameter, Bibb or Butterhead type. This variety is documented to have been grown at Monticello by Thomas Jefferson, who noted: "it does not require so much care and attention" as other types. Listed in the Slow Foods Ark of Taste, and beloved by many about a century ago.*

- Yedikule Lettuce

- *Baker Creek Heirloom Seeds*
- *The ancient 'greasy' lettuce of historic Constantinople! Ancient variety that has been grown by urban farmers near modern-day Istanbul, Turkey, for the past 1,500 years. A romaine type with long leaves, a crisp center and white seeds. Locals report that the incredible flavor and tender leaves are so juicy and high in natural oils that there is no need for dressing.*

Heirloom Herbs

- *Genovese Red Freddy Basil*

- Baker Creek Heirloom Seeds
- This deep purple Basil has the same great Genovese taste we all adore in the classic green version, but with a colorful deep purple and red kick that adds some serious flair to your dishes, herb gardens, or ornamental beds. Imagine fresh purple pesto!



- *Thai Basil*

- Seed Savers Exchange
- Spicy anise-clove scent and flavor. Most commonly used in Thai or Vietnamese cooking. Attractive plants are 12-18" tall with medium green leaves and purple stems and blossoms.

- Garlic Chives

- *Seed Savers Exchange*
- *Classic chives flavor with a hint of garlic. Perfect for seasoning many of your favorite dishes! Also produces elegant flowers to spruce up your garden.*




- Triple Curled Parsley

- *Seed Savers Exchange*
- *Closely curled dark green leaves. Fast growing uniform strain. High in vitamins and minerals. Holds for a long time at harvesting stage even in warm weather.*

- Spearmint

- *Seed Savers Exchange*
- *The dark-green, toothed leaves of this mint species are used for making tea and cocktails and for flavoring candies and desserts, as well as for adding fragrance to lotions and tinctures. Its name comes from the spear-shaped leaves!*

Wisconsin Native Plants

- Black Eyed Susan

- Prairie Nursery
- *Rudbeckia hirta*
- Exceptionally showy flowers and easy to grow, *Rudbeckia hirta* has a prolonged bloom time that attracts butterflies and other pollinators. The late season seed heads attract finches and other birds. Easy to grow and very drought tolerant, this *Rudbeckia* tolerates heat, drought and a wide range of soils, but does not like poorly-drained, wet soils.



- Anise Hyssop

- Prairie Moon Nursery
- *Agastache foeniculum*
- Anise Hyssop has flower spikes that burst with a myriad of tiny blooms that span the purple spectrum: from soft lavender to rich violet. The blossoms pop open in intervals, providing a long nectar season for bumblebees, hummingbirds, and butterflies; this plant is abuzz with pollinators all summer long!

- Purple Prairie Clover

- Prairie Moon Nursery
- *Dalea purpurea*
- Purple prairie clover has a thimble-shaped flower arrangement which blooms from the bottom to the top. These purple flowers do not have a noticeable floral scent, but the flowers attract a number of pollinators. Honeybees, bumblebees, cuckoo bees, leafcutter bees, and more visit the flowers for pollen and nectar. Even after the flowers are done blooming, Purple Prairie Clover remains very attractive due to its ornamental foliage.



- Hairy Beardtongue

- Prairie Moon Nursery
- *Penstemon hirsutus*
- Open clusters of trumpet-shaped, lavender flowers grace Hairy Beardtongue from late May to late June, attracting bumblebees, butterflies and hummingbirds. Its preference ranges for medium-wet to dry soils in varied sun conditions make it a versatile choice for home landscaping.
